




3rd April, 2016

We get to feel the changes in term of weather, it is slowly getting colder, and some comrades began to put on their masks and winter gloves. At the first check point, we managed to get the local tour guide to give us a rough briefing about the whole journey, checkpoints and expected time reaching the peak. After some rest, the big team continues the long journey.























After getting well-rested from a good night's sleep, we were getting ready to capture the view of the s rise. The photography team started setting up the tripods, cameras and other gadgets in a few selected positions around the campsite. As the sun rises, the light illuminating the dark sky over the hills, mountain and volcano, everyone was mesmerized by the breathtaking view. However, it only lasted a few minutes before the mist came back and clouded our vision. It became very cold and some went back into the tent to keep warm while the others went to explore the other hills on the peak.






On the Monday morning, after having packed and cleared the campsites, our team has now prepared to descend from Gunung Prau. Before that, our guide gave us a short briefing about the route conditions and estimated arrival time. According to him, there are 2 hiking routes down to base, that is a shorter route which consumes 1.5 to 2 hours while the other longer route will take 3 to 4 hours. The shorter route was chosen for less time consumption but our team was again reminded of the difficulty caused by slippery condition as a result of heavy rain.

As for the earlier part of the journey, the journey was a smooth one as the route is more leveled with turfing. However, after about half an hour journey, we were getting slower while going down the route due to muddy and slippery condition.

The journey down the hill is challenging, especially to some who suffered leg muscle or injuries and need others' help. Despite that, our team could still to take a break in the midst of the route at 10.30am. As for the second half of our journey, we got into the forestry area when roots form 'natural staircase'. In this area, the route condition is less slippery. Nevertheless, these large steps also took us an half and a half toreach the 2nd post, which is a cafeteria where we enjoy a tea break at about 12pm. From the post, we could enjoy scenic views which encompasses a mixture of farming and housing areas that perfectly blended with the nature. The journey lasted for another one hour and 15 minutes until all the team members reached the base camp safely at 1.15pm before heading to a nearby restaurant for lunch at 1.30pm.






5th APRIL, 2016

THE RAINING NIGHT





MOUNT MERAPI



ALIEN STONE



Big stone that is called Alien stone (Batu Alien) that was hurled out of the volcano during the eruption. It is the first destination we reached after about 25mins ride. The surroundings here are picturesque. During the Merapi Lava Tour we were came to the edge of a cliff where you can see one of the massive rivers around Merapi.

7th April 2016 THE BUNKER





Bunker was the second destination we visited. It was now in a state of ruin. During it's heyday before the destructive eruption, many photographers and adventurers would make this place their base to take beautiful photos or climb the holy mountain. Our tour guide shown us an underground bunker which was meant for people to hide during any eruption. But it failed it's purpose when two person died of suffocation by the fumes after using it during the last eruption.

It's actually located 3 metres underground, layered with 25 cm thick iron. However, the 1000 degrees Celsius hot volcanic materials, such as dry lava, buried the bunker during the last eruption.

MUSEUM SISA HARTAKU




